<u>Divisions:</u> (a rider's age is as of 1/1/23)

★ Cloverbud Leadline - Ages 5 years through 8 years. Not to be judged, all exhibitors receive participation awards. Adult to lead horse in all classes.

Beginner WT - 18 years and under - have never cantered/loped in any competition or on the grounds thereof, exhibitors over 12 should be in their first or second year of riding. In Walk Trot when the animal performs more than 3 continuous strides of canter the rider will be penalized.

Advanced Beginner WTC- 18 years and under - exhibitors may compete in Advanced Beginner one season or eight shows. Cantering/loping may be done briefly, individually, or in small groups.

Junior - 13 years and under

Senior - 14 years through 18 years

General Rules:

The Cheshire County 4-H Horse Leaders follow the New England 4-H Horse Show Rules and Guidelines. A rulebook is available at https://extension.unh.edu/resources/files/Resource001859 Rep2665.pdf as well as in the show office.

- 1. Pre-Entry must be postmarked seven (7) days prior to the date of the show.
- 2. Exhibitors will receive one number per division/per horse and/or seat.
- 3. No dogs allowed on the fairgrounds, for liability reasons.
- 4. Exhibitors must pay for all classes in advance, or a signed blank check must be left at the show office. Exhibitors must obtain their number before entering the ring.
- 5. A horse may have more than one rider, but each rider must obtain and pay for a number. A rider may ride more than one horse. Each rider/horse combination will be issued a number. No horse or rider may compete against themselves in one division. Each horse/rider number combination will pay a separate entry fee.
- 6. A rider may ride both seats in their division but must pay two entry fees to do so. A rider may only enter one division, for example Junior, Senior, or Adult.
- 7. Day stall rentals are available on the grounds for a \$25.00 fee. Stalls must be cleaned out after the show.
- 8. Proof of a negative Coggins must be available for all out of state horses (within 12 months). A current rabies vaccination (within 12 months) is required for all animals on the grounds.
- 9. No one may approach the judge with any questions without first obtaining permission from show management.
- 10. Classes may be combined or cancelled at the show management's discretion.
- 11. Unruly or unsound horses may be excused at the judge's or show management's discretion and the decision of the judge will be final.
- 12. Beginner Walk/Trot and Walk/Trot/Canter classes are for beginner riders not beginner horses! Green horses should be shown in the green horse division.
- 13. Walk/Trot riders found to be intentionally cantering on the grounds will be removed from the walk/trot division.
- 14. All accounts must be settled and paid in full before the end of the day. A fee of at least \$30.00 will be assessed for any check returned for "Insufficient Funds". In the event of a returned check, all outstanding checks and bank fees must be paid in full before you may enter the next show.

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New Hampshire 4-H Event Youth Code of Conduct

4-H is committed to providing a welcoming community and an inclusive culture that allows all youth to feel a sense of belonging and to participate fully and safely. Our values include civility and mutual respect among our youth participants. 4-H has very high standards and expectations for conduct. Parents/guardians and participants are responsible for reviewing and agreeing to follow these expectations.

- 1. Be on time and participate fully.
- 2. Be respectful, use good manners, and follow instructions.
- 3. Be honest. We expect integrity.
- 4. Show mutual respect for each other's differences and ideas.
- 5. 4-H events are tobacco, drug, vaping and alcohol-free.
- 6. Youth are expected to use appropriate language.
- 7. Abide by specific program rules and regulations, including all health and safety procedures.
- 8. Treat program areas, lodging areas and transportation vehicles with respect. You will be responsible for any damage, theft, or misconduct in which you participate.
- 9. Dress appropriately for 4-H programs. Follow the dress code if there is one. If you're not sure, ask.
- 10. Conduct that is harmful to the safety and well-being of self or others is not tolerated.
- 11. The possession of fireworks, firearms, knives or any other weapons is not permitted at 4-H events unless specifically approved for the program by the staff or volunteers in charge.
- 12. Live up to your highest expectations for yourself so that you can return home proud of who you are and what you have done.
- 13. 4-H events are free of bullying (including cyberbullying), hazing, and harassment.
- 14. Help all persons in your group feel that they belong by making every attempt to include all participants in all activities.
- 15. Code of Conduct expectations apply to the use of social media before, during and after the event.
- 16. For remote learning activities, participants are expected to refrain from:
 - a. Taking and/or sharing photos or screenshots of images/videos of classmates or instructors without permission.
 - b. 'Chattting' privately between classmates or instructors during a group meeting or activity.
 - c. Publicly sharing login/connection information to a private meeting.
 - d. Private one-to-one interaction between adults and youth.

If any of these expectations are not followed, or additional conduct issues arise, 4-H staff will review the situation to determine if any actions must be taken. Final action could result in immediate dismissal from the program without a refund.
